## Trull CE VA Primary School Maths Expectations and Ideas

SEN  Things you can do at home:	
<ul> <li>Use a times table clock</li> </ul>	Bonds up to 12 - shut the box
<ul> <li>iPad app – Squeebles times tables</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Bonds up to 13 - Patience pyramid game where you remove either a king (which equals 13) or two cards that make 13 (e.g. 8 and 5). Idea is to remove all of the cards in the pyramid</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Using money</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Tuck Shop Maths where your child has to 'buy' tins, fruit, cereals etc. You will need to create a price list.</li> </ul>
<ul><li>Sum painting</li></ul>	<ul> <li>Collect some travel brochures from a travel agent. Ask your child to plan and 'cost up' a holiday for the family.</li> </ul>
• Car Park Maths	<ul> <li>Provide your child with some paint and ask them to solve addition questions and thumb print the answers.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Shape Hunt</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>answers. This activity is so fun that children often don't even realise they are learning. You draw out a car park onto a large piece of paper, number the spaces and then encourage your child to try and park the cars in the corresponding correct space.</li> </ul>
Maths Scavenger Hunt	Get your children to move around the house and garden looking for different shapes.
	• Scatter some measurable objects around the house and garden. Give your child a grid with some pre-set weights and lengths on. It will then be a challenge for them to find something in the garden that is approximately 10cm long, or something in the house that weighs 300g (as an example). Get your child to gather all of the items they think match the weights and lengths on the card, and check how well they have done with some kitchen scales and a tape measure.
