At Trull Church of England Primary School, the progress of children is now tracked in great detail and the information we have is used to inform future planning. Where a child is working below or significantly below the expected level for their age, interventions and support are planned. These may be delivered by a teacher, teaching assistant or an outside agency.

Our tracking can also highlight children who do not appear to be making progress over a period of time. Children's learning is not always linear but may have a burst and then plateau for a period of consolidation. Where a pattern of 'no progress' develops, the teacher along with the Senior Leadership Team will consider what intervention is required.

Throughout the term, teachers have been planning and assessing your child's learning against a series of age-related learning objectives linked to the national curriculum. When your child successfully achieves a learning objectives, this is recorded as 'achieved', using the school's electronic tracking system.

As well as reporting your child's achievement, we think it is important to tell you how effective your child is as a learner and also their attendance. Both of these will have a significant impact on the progress your child makes.

To enable children to make the greatest progress, it is important that school and home work in partnership, and that we keep you informed of your child's progress. These reports, therefore, fit into a cycle of verbal and written progress reports:
