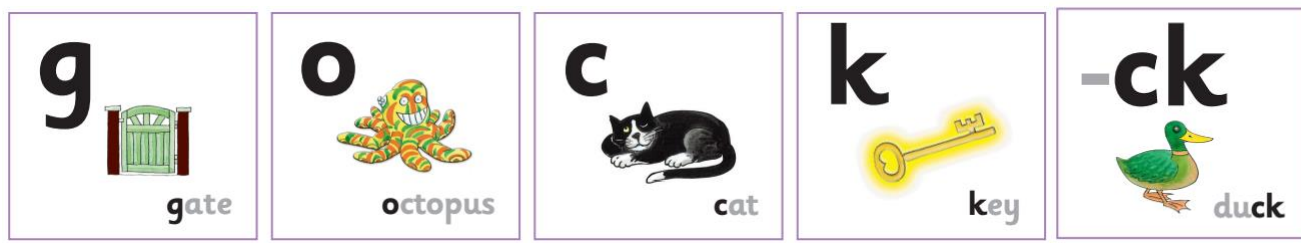


Home Phonics Practice Week 3

This week in phonics we have learnt the following phonemes. Practise saying each sound aloud.



Point to the letters below in and out of order. Remember to use pure sounds e.g. 'nnnnnnn' not 'nuh'.

Blending games are a good way to help children begin to realise putting sounds together can make real words. E.g. 'Can you find your s- o- ck- s?' 'Please put your shoes on the m- a- t.' 'Can you wash your hands at the t- a- p?' 'Where is your t- o- p?'
